Character Study: Collin Trimble

A quiet observer with a powerful gift—and the heart of a hero.

Overview

We first meet **Collin Trimble** as "the headphone-wearing kid" in Mikaela's English class. He's quiet, shy, and clearly a bit different from the rest of the students, which makes him a frequent target for bullying. When Mikaela sees how Malcolm treats him, she steps in and invites Collin to join the Drone Legends.

Collin has a rare and extraordinary ability: he can sense the emotions of living things, especially plants and animals. At first, this seems strange—like when he tells Mr. Singh that his fish are too warm because "they told him." But soon, his gift becomes vital to the team. He uses it to help find Jorge after the shipwreck, to locate a clue in the mountains, and even to calm a giant anaconda threatening the group.

Though Collin struggles with confidence and self-expression, his sensitivity turns out to be one of the team's greatest strengths. With the support of the Drone Legends, he becomes braver, more open, and a vital part of the group.
